
STEM BEGINNINGS

The Town of Webster is extremely fortunate to have a vibrant thriving library, a library that is truly the hub of the community offering a wide variety of program options designed to meet the needs of all of our townspeople.

This community hub didn't happen by accident; it was the result of collaboration and cooperation between several important groups.

First of all, we are so fortunate to have an extremely dedicated staff. Led by a very competent Director, the library staff not only has a keen understanding of library science, but even more importantly, the staff understands our Town and the people in our Town. They are able to use their expertise to guide patrons and to develop appropriate programming that demonstrates their understanding of our community and helps us all to stretch and grow.

In addition to the professional staff, the library has an active and engaged Friends group. 

Native American Nipmuc Lithic Artifacts in Central New England

The presentation will be followed by the business portion of the meeting.

Joseph Iamartino began his career as a teenage volunteer at the Institute for American Indian Studies in Washington, Ct. He has traveled and researched historic sites in North & South America, Europe, Japan, China, Israel, and Morocco for over 40 years. He is currently the President of the Thompson Historical Society which operates four museums and is a member of the New England Antiquities Research Association. His academic credentials include a B.S. in Electrical Engineering from the University of Rhode Island and a M.S. from Worcester Polytechnic Institute.
