
Fran Hart: The Beat Generation, A Cultural Review of the 1950s Through Music August 5th 6:00 PM







Slate of Officers

The Annual Election of Officers for the Town of Webster is held on the first Monday of May each year. At these local elections, at least one and often two slots for the Library Board of Trustees are open. This year, two members of our community were voted into office. Jeanne Mikels won re-election to the Board of Library Trustees and Susan Veshi won her first term to the Board.

Susan has lived in Webster since 1987. She and her husband raised their two children in town and Susan has served on various boards and committees. She has been employed at Nichols College for twenty-five years and is currently serving as the vice president for advancement at the college.
