**Strategic Planning** 



Representatives from the Board of Trustees, the Staff and the Friends have been working on a five year strategic plan for the library. We have completed phase one and two of the project which included developing the project plan and collecting and summarizing feedback from the Staff and the community.

First and foremost, a sincere thank you to everyone who participated in the focus groups and who completed the surveys. Your responses are an important part of the data collection and will help us to develop the strategic plan for the Library.

We have conducted three focus groups, three internal surveys (Trustees and Friends, Staff members, and strategic planning committee surveys) and two public surveys (community members and the tween and teen survey). We have collected a lot of information from a wide range of community members.

You may ask: Why develop a strategic plan? A strategic plan will help the Trustees to develop long term and short term goals and objectives. The data collected will be used to not only identify the strengths of the current library but to help the Trustees better understand the needs of the community so that we can plan for the future of the library.

A strategic plan will help us to answer questions like: How can we reach all of the members of our community? What type of programming will help us to respond to our current needs and help move us into the future? What is needed to improve our facility? What are our staffing needs?

The Trustees have collected information from the community and have begun to synthesize and summarize that information. Our next steps will be to develop a strategic plan which will include a mission statement, a vision statement and goals and objectives.

It is exciting work, work that will help our library to continue to grow and be responsive to the needs of our community!
